

BEHAVIOR EXPECTATIONS
AND CODE OF CONDUCT FORM

The AnBryce community is guided by four principles of behavior: courtesy, cooperation, caring and concern. When participants say "please" and "thank you," open the door for others, responds politely when spoken to, and look a person in the eye when talking with him/her, a community standard of courtesy and good will is established and preserved. These small, but important, gestures instill respect for others in our participants. We welcome the cooperation and support of parents in upholding these standards.

We expect the participants to be responsible for their own actions, to use good judgment, to be kind, and to respect others. The participant's self-discipline is of the utmost importance. Honesty and integrity are essential to our community of mutual trust.

Rules are developed to prevent harm to your child and to others, to prevent damage of property, and to respect the rights of others. When necessary, the directors and appropriate staff of the AnBryce Foundation will address infractions using disciplinary methods that promote self-direction, self-reflection, and cooperation. It is our role, as adults, to help campers understand why certain actions are inappropriate, while teaching them to hold themselves and each other to higher standards of conduct.

Certain infractions are unacceptable in any of our programs. If such an incident occurs, parents and/or guardians are notified of any behavior problems immediately and will be asked to pick up their child if it is deemed necessary.

The following behavior may result in the student being dismissed from the AnBryce Foundation programs.

1. Physical and/or verbal abuse.
2. Harassment of others.
3. The use of foul language, including offensive slang and profanity.
4. Possession, distribution and/or use of any illegal substance, such as tobacco, alcohol, or non-prescription drugs.
5. Guns and knives are absolutely prohibited.
6. Leaving the program area or facilities without permission.
7. Defacing the program area, facilities, property and grounds, etc.
8. Inappropriate contact or behavior of a sexual nature or otherwise.

Please discuss this policy with your child/children before signing. Your signature and the student's signature indicate that you and your child have reviewed the behavior expectations and code of conduct for the AnBryce Foundation programs/Camp Dogwood.
